1. Animals must be kept clean.
2. Neck ties will be mandatory on all animals. Animals will not be turned loose, includes arenas.
3. Head and tail must have been clipped within three weeks of the fair.
4. Animals shall be gentle enough for exhibitor to lead to and from the show ring unassisted.
5. Hooves shall be shaped and trimmed. No long hooves permitted.
6. Animal must be free of unsightly medical disorders. Excessive warts, warbles or other unsightly conditions shall be grounds for disqualification, and exhibitor may be asked to remove the animal from the grounds. Determination will be made by the livestock superintendent. Bovine Tuberculosis (TB) Testing proof is required for animals six months or older.
7. **Exhibitors must submit a form of ID with each entry as by state rules. If not submitted by close of entry, a \$5.00 fee will be charged. (See State Rules, Section VIII Livestock Department, #27 A-C)**
8. Stall Cards must be displayed above stall.

1. All animals to be sifted for health.
2. All animals are to be registered Does.
3. All animals must have 60 day ownership.
4. Animals must be clean and show evidence of clipping within three weeks prior to the show.
5. All animals must be tattooed prior to arrival on the Fairgrounds and free of excess ink. All tattoos must match registration papers *exactly*. Any discrepancies at the time of the tattoo check will result in immediate disqualification. Junior kids are allowed to have registration papers pending.
6. All goats must be free of horns (disbudded, naturally polled, dehorned). Small scurs will be accepted.
7. All dairy goats must be enrolled in the Scrapie Eradication program. This requires individual identification. See State Rules, page 62 – Sheep and Goat Health Rules.
8. Each exhibitor is limited to 16 animals per division.
9. Group classes limited to one entry per sire or dam per exhibitor. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor and exhibited in an individual class to be eligible for groups.
10. Milking stanchions and grooming equipment will be restricted to designated areas.
11. Exhibitors needing to dispose of milk shall do so only in the wash racks. Dumping of milk down any other drains will result in loss of premiums.
12. Milkers must be milking or accompanied by a valid service memo.
13. Stall cards must be displayed above stall or pen.
14. Animals are not eligible for auction.

9. JUNIOR GET OF SIRE NOT IN MILK: Two does sired by same buck. Yearlings not in milk or younger. Must be bred by exhibitor.
10. GET OF SIRE: Two does sired by the same buck, at least one to be a yearling or older in milk or dry milker.
11. DAM & DAUGHTER: One doe and one of her daughters, any age, owned by exhibitor. Daughter must be bred by exhibitor.
12. BEST THREE FEMALES: Three does of any age, need not be related, but must be of the same breed. Exhibitor limited to one entry.
13. DAIRY HERD: Three does in milk. Exhibitor limited to one entry.

JUNIOR HORSE

1. No stallions are permitted.
2. Horses/Ponies must be leased or owned by exhibitor or exhibitor's family for at least 120 days prior to opening day of the fair. Registration/proof of ownership shall be submitted to the fair no later 120 days before the first day of the fair. This includes 4-H and FFA.
3. State fair and local rules found elsewhere in premium book apply to this department. All classes will be judged by the American system. USEF (www.usef.org) and State Fair rules will govern all classes.
4. Exhibitors must enter the appropriate class in the division by the close of entries.
5. It is the project leaders/advisors responsibility to verify eligibility before signing entry forms.
6. All patterns will be posted one hour prior to the beginning of the show.
7. Exhibitor must be on hand and ready to show when class is called to the ring. Those exhibitors with conflicting fair show schedules (i.e. rabbits, cavy, chicken or pigs) must notify the show manager and an attempt will be made to accommodate exhibitor. Final decision is left to the judge and judges decision is final.
8. All animals must be on the grounds by 8:00 a.m. on the first day of the Fair. regardless of class entered.
9. When leaving the show area, please leave quietly as the loading and moving of trailers is disruptive to those still showing.
10. ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn at all times while mounted by all exhibitors.
11. Horses can be shown either Western or English in Trail division.
12. In the event of rain, Horse Showmanship Classes will be held at an alternate location at the IV Expo grounds. The Junior Horse Show classes (mounted classes) will be rescheduled for a later date to be determined by management.
13. All showmanship exhibitors must be in their complete 4-H or FFA uniform as described below.
 - a. **4-H Showmanship**: Uniform consists of white pants, long sleeved white shirt with the official 4-H tie or scarf or jacket, belt, 4-H hat or helmet, and boots. Horse to be shown with a halter and lead with or without stud chain.

- b. **FFA Showmanship:** Uniform consists of white pants, white dress shirt (long sleeves required if jacket is not worn), the FFA emblem must be attached to the left front pocket of the shirt, FFA jacket is acceptable. Western hat or helmet is optional. Horse to be shown with a halter and lead with or without a stud chain.
14. Attire: all other classes may be shown in either above stated 4-H or FFA uniform or standard horse show attire as described in the USEF rule book.
 15. Divisions with less than 3 entries may be combined or cancelled.
 16. Horses must be under control at all times anywhere on the grounds or in the arena. Horses presenting a danger to themselves or others may be excused from the arena and/or the show.
 17. This is an educational, fun event for our exhibitors, parents, guardians or leaders will be subject to removal from the premises for the remainder of the show with no refund of monies paid.
 18. Tack requirements: USEF rules will be followed.
 19. Divisions: exhibitors may not cross-enter divisions on the same horse.

Division 430: 4-H Novice Walk/Trot Beginning Rider

Limited to 1st and 2nd year showing. Based on the rider (no age limit). Once an exhibitor moves into walk, trot, canter class (this includes English, Western, and Gymkhana divisions or in any judged event) they may not move back into the walk/trot beginning rider division. Once having shown at State Horse Classic or State Fair rider must move out of this division.

Division 431: 4-H Junior – Exhibitor 9-13 years of age

Division 432: 4-H Senior – Exhibitor 14 years and over

Division 433: FFA Novice – Walk/Trot Beginning Rider

Limited to 1st year showing

Division 434: FFA Advanced

Novice classes are only for those that have never shown a horse before. First place novice exhibitors in Division 430 may move to Division 431 or Division 432 (depending on age) and First place exhibitor in Division 433 may move to Division 434.

Classes apply to Divisions 430-434:

- Class 1: Showmanship (in hand, shown English or Western)
- Class 2: Western Equitation (rail work only, judged on the rider)
- Class 3: Western Horsemanship (pattern class, judged on the rider's ability to complete a pattern)
- Class 4: Western Pleasure (judged on the horse's way of going)
- Class 5: Trail (pattern over obstacles)
- Class 6: English Equitation (rail work only, judged on rider)
- Class 7: English Pleasure (judged on the horse's way of going)
- Class 8: Gymkhana (Cloverleaf Barrels, speed barrels, pole bending, single pole, quadrangle, birangle, etc.)

Horse Showmanship

1. Criteria: Exhibitors will be judged on their ability of presenting his or her horse to the judge, cleanliness and grooming of the exhibitor and horse and control of the animal.
2. Horses may not be shared by family members or any other exhibitors.
3. 1st and 2nd place winners of Divisions 431, 432 and 434, are eligible to go to Round Robin, and must make their horse available for Round Robin practice. See posted schedule in Livestock Office for Large Animal Round Robin practice.
4. Horse showmanship will receive Rosettes 1-8 and Premiums paid 1st - 4th.

JUNIOR BREEDING SHEEP

1. Animals shall be clean.
2. Hooves shall not be longer than 1/8-inch from sole.
3. Animals must be free of unsightly medical disorders.
4. Flock numbers will be used to identify all animals. Numbers shall be on regular and practical tags attached to the ear or tattooed in the ear. Exhibitor may not use the same flock number on more than one animal during two consecutive calendar years.
5. Registration numbers may not be used as flock numbers.
6. All breeding sheep must be enrolled in the Scrapie Eradication program. This requires individual identification. **(See State Rules, Section X Animal Health Rules, Sheep and Goat Health Rules)**
7. LAMBS MUST SHOW LAMBS' TEETH.
8. Ewes entered in the market sheep division may not be exhibited in the breeding division and vice versa. Violation of this rule will exclude the exhibitor from competition in all departments of the fair.
9. **Exhibitors must submit a form of ID with each entry as by state rules. If not submitted by close of entry, a \$5.00 fee will be charged. (See State Rules, Section VIII Livestock Department, #27 A-C)**
10. Stall Cards must be displayed above stall.
11. AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING
12. State Rule – **Tail Docking.** To qualify for exhibit market lambs must be docked such that the tail (dock) is healed and can be lifted from the exterior. Lambs that have no dock will not be eligible.

1. Animals shall have feet trimmed. Excessive hoof length shall be grounds for disqualification.
2. Animals must be clean.
3. Animals must be lice free. Animals suffering unsightly wounds or medical disorders shall be disqualified. Exhibitor may be asked to remove disqualified animals from the grounds. Determination will be made by the livestock superintendent.
4. Boars may not be used for showmanship.
5. Draw ear notching on entry form and use numbers to identify notching.
6. Gilts entered in the market swine division may not be exhibited in the breeding division and vice-versa. Any violation of this rule will exclude the exhibitor from competition in all departments of the fair.
7. **Exhibitors must submit a form of ID with each entry as by state rules. If not submitted by close of entry, a \$5.00 fee will be charged. (See State Rules, Section VIII Livestock Department, #27 A-C)**
8. Stall cards must be displayed above stall.

PYGMY GOATS

1. Only registered does and wethers may be shown.
2. All animals must have a tattoo or microchip. Tattoo or microchip must match registration or ownership papers exactly. No exceptions. If microchip is used, the owner must provide a microchip scanner at time of livestock check in. Any discrepancies with the tattoo or microchip, whether at check in or during the show, will result in immediate disqualification. Junior kids are allowed to have registration pending.
3. Animals must be free of horns (disbudded, naturally polled, dehorned).
4. Age is determined by first day of Fair.
5. Minimum ownership - 60 days prior to start of fair (except kids born to animals meeting ownership requirement).
6. All animals to be sifted for health.
7. All pygmy goats must be enrolled in the Scrapie Eradication program. This requires individual identification. **(See State Rules, Section X Animal Health Rules, Sheep and Goat Health Rules)**
8. Each exhibitor is limited to 8 animals per division, if room is available. Fair Management has the right to alter or change this provision.
9. All animals must show evidence of grooming within three weeks of the Fair.
10. All animals must be pre-registered, same date as market goat project.
11. Animals not eligible for auction.
12. Stall cards must be displayed above stall.
13. AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING.

5. Yearling, freshened at least once, need not be in milk at the show.
6. Two years old but not yet three years old
7. Three years old and older.
8. Dam and Daughter
9. Breeder's Trio - three (3) animals (does and wethers) any age, all owned by exhibitor.
